You will have been given a **four-digit code** which gives you access to the front and rear keypads (guests mainly use backdoor). An important note is that the cottage is privately located at the end of Boundary Road which is a local dirt road. Please drive slowly and be prepared for inclement weather during the winter months. The road is plowed when there is six or more inches of snow. **A four-wheel drive vehicle is highly recommended during winter weather.** 

Check out is 11:00AM to provide for cleaning between guests.

Garbage is picked up every Thursday from the end of the driveway.

In the event you have forgotten toiletries the bathroom closet contains items for your convenience.

Heat – Each room has independently controlled thermostats for the electric baseboard heaters. Cooling – The living room has the window AC unit and each bedroom has an oscillating fan. Lights – Outdoor and fire place lights are set on a timer from sundown to midnight.

# Cottage Courtesy

We want to take care of you the best we can and in return we ask you to take care of a few things for us:

- No smoking or vaping any substances indoors
- No pets
- No parties or event hosting
- Do not throw anything besides provided septic safe bathroom tissue down toilet
- No food or other items down drains
- Do not use fireplace for interior fires (logs for decoration only)
- No candles or other flame (insurance purposes)
- No fireworks

# **Before You Leave**

- Clean all dishware, leaving on drying rack is okay (we like low-cost cleaning fees too!)
- Place all rubbish from your stay into receptacle at the end of the driveway
- Outdoor area must be clean as the cleaning service does not do any outside cleaning.
- Lock the front and rear door by using keypad

The patio lights are set on a timer but can be turned on manually by pressing the power button on the timer.

### **Smokeless Fire Pit**

In the **dry box** located near the stone patio you will find **split fire wood** to burn which I attempt to restock between each guest. Additional fire wood can be found at local convenience stores.

We believe that a fire pit is a cornerstone to enjoying the outdoor experience and are happy to offer it to you. With that said these are the strict rules that we need you to follow in order to continue to offer it to guests.

- Do not move fire pit from its location to prevent damage to string lights
- Only burn wood logs especially only ones that fit in the ring
- Keep fire covered with mesh lid
- Do not start or continue a fire during wind or storming conditions
- Never leave a fire unattended (fire extinguisher on kitchen counter for emergency)

### Pellet Grill / Smoker (spring, summer, fall)

The smoker's pellet box is preloaded and ready for use. To operate:

- Plug in / <u>Open Lid</u> / Select "Smoke"
- Let smoke for about 5 minutes
- Select cooking temperature
- When finished turn knob to "off" and keep it plugged in through cool down cycle

# Kayaks!

The two sit on top kayaks are great for all levels of experience and anglers. Paddles and life jackets are found with the kayaks. The state of Pennsylvania requires that all paddlers wear a life jacket who are 12 years of age or younger and anyone between the months of November 1<sup>st</sup> and April 30<sup>th</sup>.

The best place to launch is at Seeley's Landing. After making a left into the Landing from Route 507 you can drive all the way to the end of the road where you will see the docks and boats. Just be mindful of the boat ramp. There is no charge for parking or launching the kayaks.

Playing cards and board games are located in the kitchen drawer to the left of the stove.

Netflix subscription included with the cottage, feel free to use other streaming services you have an account with.
